HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES'S ADDRESS on the occasion of the opening of

the PRINCE OF WALES'S ROYAL INDIAN MILITARY COLLEGE.

#### 13th MARCH, 1922.

As General Jacob has said, the services of the forces of India in the Great War won for the rising generation of Indians the right to hold the King's Commission, and the path to the highest ranks in the Indian Army is now open to India's young mer. Hever has a fairer or more honourable field been displayed before them; and I look with confidence to young India to prove worthy of the great opporutnities won for them by the soldiers of an older India in the hour of supreme trial.

From my own experience I may say that it is the first few blows on the anvil of life that give the human weapon the set and temper which carries it through life's battles. It is the pride of the English Public Schools that they have supplied the early training of those British Officers, who with the aid of the gallant body of Indian Officers, have for years led and guided the fighting men of India to victory on many fields.

It is in order to give you the same opportunities and edvantages that this College has been established. The young men of India, who wish to go later to sandhurst, and who aspire to hold a King's Commission, will receive their early training here.

I trust that those who are responsible for the administration of this College will keep before them, not only the great ideals of the Public Schools of England, but will also foster and maintain the fine old Indian spirit of mutual reverence who bound together the Guru and his Chela.

To those who aspire to the honour of a King's Commission, I say: - Work hard; play hard, live upright and honest lives; maintain untarnished the great martial traditions of India's fighting men; keep unsullied the chivalry and honour wich has been handed down to you as a heritage by the Indian Princes and warriors of old, by the Indian Officers of the past and by the British Officers who have trained the Indian soldier in peace and led him in war.

I shall always follow with interest the fortunes of a College which is to bear my name. I hope that its future record will make me proud of it.

## Opening Address by the Commandant.

#### February 1922.

Cadets, I have called you together today in order to mention to you personally a few points upon which it is necessary that there should be a clear understanding. But first of all let me bid you welcome and congratulate you upon being selected to become Cadets at this College. The mere fact that you have been selected is in itself a great honour and I want you to realise from the very start the nature of the honour that has been conferred upon you and what it implies. Further, I wish you, each one of you, to determine to prove yourselves worthy of this honour.

Now as you know, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales has graciously consented to open this College, which is to be called "The Prince of Wales Royal Indian Military College." It is surely a great honour to have been selected from the whole of the youth of India to be one of the first Cadets at a College to which the son of the King-Emperor has given his name. Now we have in English a saying "Great honours are great burdens;" let us see what sort of burden we all have now to take upon our shoulders. Our association with this College means for every one of us, myself, the Staff and Cadets, that we have a great responsibility thrown upon us. It is our work to prepare you and your work to do all you can to make your-selves fit to go on to another Military College whence, if you are successful, you will become officers of the Indian Army.

The position of a commissioned officer signifies the implicit trust of the King-Emperor in a loyal and faithful subject, to whom he commits the welfare and training of his soldiers, relying upon his officers at all times and in all circumstances for the protection of his person and his Empire. Surely no greater honour could be desired by any one than to be given that trust and confidence. Now I must tell you at once that to become an officer, which is your eventual goal, demands a very high standard of fitness, moral, educational and physical; and, if you are finally to reach that goal, you cannot commence too early your efforts to render yourselves fit in every way.

The honour and efficiency of the Army is a thing so precious and of such vital importance that I shall refuse absolutely to recommend the retention at this College of any boy who shows that he is unlikely to be a credit to the Army.

As far as I can see there is no reason why any of you should fail to reach the necessary standard of fitness, if, from this moment, you conscientiously and with firm determination apply yourselves to the task.

I myself and the members of the staff are going to help you to the full extent of our capabilities, but it will mainly rest with you and your individual efforts to prove that your selection as Cadets was well justified and to ensure the success of this College.

Now another responsibility which you Cadets take upon you from today is the task of safeguarding and upholding the name of this College. Nay, you have to do even more than this, for with you lies the task of making a name for the College.

One of the things which go to make the good tone, the spirit, and hence the good name of a school, a College or a Regiment is "tradition."

Some of our old English Public Schools have been established for over 500 years and in that long period of existence they have built up a name for themselves based on a glorious tradition of hundreds of years.

"Tradition" means "that which is handed down" and in the sense which we are using the word we mean the spirit, the tone and the pride in a glorious past which leads every boy to guard as a precious jewel the good name of his College. There are doubtless black sheep in every flock but speaking generally you may say that such a tradition, once formed, is so strong a factor in determining the good tone of a body of boys or men that amongst them few written laws or restrictions are necessary, for each boy or man is governed by the unwritten law of tradition, which tells him what is right and what is wrong and prevents him from doing anything that would be smirch in the eyes of the world the fair name of the Regiment or College to which he belongs.

Now as this College is a new institution it lies with us all, and with you boys even more than with the Staff, to form a basis of "Tradition" for this College. Remember the eyes of all India are upon you. It is therefore incumbent upon you, not only whilst you are here but throughout your lives, to adopt such a mode of life that will enhance the good name of the College and never to act in such a manner that you will bring discredit upon it. I hope therefore that you, the first batch of Cadets, will be a model for all who come after, in conduct, bearing and all round efficiency.

Such, then, is the nature of the responsibility, the burden which the honour of being selected as a Cadet here implies. Now let me give you some points which will help you to fulfil the responsibilities which rest upon you. You all received yesterday a copy of the Standing Orders of this College and I want you to study them carefully. You must remember that you are now Cadets, not school boys, that is to say you are, as it were, "baby soldiers," and in the Army ignorance of orders is no excuse, so long as the opportunity of becoming acquainted with them has been afforded.

The whole efficiency and daily life of an Army is based upon good discipline which perhaps I may describe as "training to act in accordance with rules and regulations that have been formulated for the common good."

So the sooner you become accustomed to discipline and acquire the habit of implicit, cheerful and intelligent obedience of orders the easier will life in the Army be for your hereafter, and the better Commanders you yourselves will be when the time comes for you to command others.

You will notice that I say "cheerful and intelligent obedience." I do not want grudging, grumbling obedience; that is not the spirit at all. I want the type of willing, cheerful obedience that leads to unhesitating performance of whatever is required, with the utmost zeal and energy that you can command, however great the personal inconvenience or even hardship may be.

In this connection I will repeat that you are now no longer school boys but are Cadets, who, have been honoured by being selected to come here and who are aspiring to the still higher honour of becoming officers: therefore you are presumably men of honour. For this reason you will be trusted to obey and carry out such orders as are from time to time given for your guidance and the general welfare of the College.

You will never be spied upon, but will be trusted, as men of honour, to do that which is right.

Let me give you an instance of what I mean.

You have seen in Standing Orders that no smoking is allowed here. Well, I trust you all not to smoke. If I hear of a boy being caught smoking I shall punish him to the full extent of my powers, not because there is any great sin in the actual fact of smoking, but because it is against orders which you have been

trusted to observe, and by the non-observance of which a boy shows himself to be lacking in a sense of honour such as is essential in a Military Cadet.

Another point concerning which I desire that there should be a clear understanding is this. I am determined that a spirit of good fellowship and friendliness shall prevail throughout this College.

Once you come here you are all "Cadets" and each one is just as good as his neighbour.

We have here boys from all over His Majesty's Indian Empire, Sikhs, Pathans, Burmans, Bengalis and so on; and it is right and proper that each should take a pride in his birth, his people, and his own district. But, I would have you observe that this College is not called the Prince of Wales, 'Pathan' Military College, or 'Sikh' Military College, but the Prince of Wales 'Indian' Military College.

Moreover, you are aspiring to be officers of the Indian Army, the force upon which the King-Emperor and people of India rely to guard, not some special portion but the whole of the Indian Empire.

Now what does this imply? It means that first and foremost you must remember that you are loyal subject of the King-Emperor and that beyond that you are 'Indians' first and Burmans or Pathans or whatever the case may be afterwards.

Now unless an Army is pervaded by a spirit of comradeship and a determination to sink all personal and party grievances in a united effort for the common cause, that Army can never be truly efficient. And so it is with this College, and to ensure its success you must all strive for the common good. I may tell you all, at once that I will not for one moment tolerate anything in the way of quarrelling or factions amongst the Cadets and in you all, whether at work or at play, I shall expect to see a spirit of good feeling and friendship, a spirit of mutual assistance and sympathy.

Some of you are older than others, some have had greater educational and social advantages than others and thus in many ways can help those who have not had the same advantages.

Remember this is a Military College and therefore amongst other things we are going to lay the foundation of Military discipline. Now there is nothing irksome or unpleasant in the observance of Military discipline such as it is essential that you Cadets should observe.

I will enumerate some of the points connected with Military discipline which you must constantly bear in mind.

- (1) Prompt, unhesitating and cheerful obedience of all orders received, whether written or verbal.
- (2) Punctuality for every sort of duty.
- (3) Careful exactness in the performance of all duties.

Any thing in the way of shirking duty, trusting to not being found out, is a most serious breach of Military discipline. No personal consideration or convenience should ever be allowed to interefere with the proper performance of Military duty.

- (4) Cleanliness and general smartness in "turn out."
   A Cadet who is slovenly and untidy in his dress cannot be classed as a good Cadet in all respects.
- (5) Steadiness and smartness on parade.

Intimately connected with Military discipline is what is termed 'soldierly spirit,' a spirit which it will be our endeavour to foster here, and which you must make every endeavour to acquire. Some of the essentials of such a spirit are as follows:—

- (1) Devotion to the King-Emperor and Country.
- (2) Proper pride in the uniform which you wear.
- (3) Loyalty to one's superiors.
- (4) Courage, coolness, and cheerfullness in time of trial and hardship, a spirit of determination to endure and conquer at all costs.

Remember you are never beaten until you admit you are. The great Napoleon said that the English only won the battle of Waterloo because they did not know when they were beaten: but still they won.

- In this connection I have no doubt that there are many of you who have since childhood had many servants at your beck and call, but I want you all to remember that there is nothing detrimental to a man's dignity in doing good honest work with his own hands. An officer should be able to do all that he calls upon his men to do and should be in a position to show them that he can do it. Unless he has at some time or other done such work, as say digging trenches, himself how can he appreciate what he is asking his men to do or judge what standard of work he can in fairness demand from them? Again there are occassions when an officer can greatly inspire his men by sharing personally in the work which they have to perform.
- of one's College and one's friends, disregard of self. Not looking for personal advantage but for that of the Country and College, later on your Regiment and your men. Playing for the team in fact and not for yourself.
- (6) Keenness and the giving of one's best to any duty.
- (7) Keeping one's self fit mentally and physically. A Cadet (and this applies to all soldiers) who through his own fault, or by reason of his mode of life, renders himself unfit is unworthy to serve the King-Emperor and his Country.
- (8) Honourable dealings with all men generally.

Now all that I have been saying may sound rather alarming to you boys, and indeed I mean it to be taken seriously, for the sooner you grasp these facts the easier will you take to Military life and the better men you will be afterwards.

But do not think that it is going to be all work here and no play. I am anxious that you shall have plenty of time for games and I want you to take plenty of healthy exercise, and hope to see you enjoying yourselves doing it. All I say to you is "while at work, work hard; and while at play, play hard." We are not trying to turn out simply "candidates" at this College, we hope to turn out "Men"; so I say to you, "in all you do above all things be men."

Some of you are but small boys as yet and I quite realise that you may have had difficulty in understanding all I have said, so I will ask you now to go away to your Masters who will run through it with you and explain any points which may not be clear to you.

And I would remind you of this. You are here to learn and we are hear to teach you, are anxious to teach you, and realise that some of you may often fail to understand straight away what is said. So I earnestly pray you all never to allow anything to pass without understanding it, and never to be afraid during lessons of holding up your hand and saying "Please, Sir, I don't understand that, will you explain it again."

Finally. I will add that I hope that in days to come you will look back upon the days spent at this College as a very happy and profitable period of your lives.

#### PROGRAMME

#### HISTORICAL NOTE

The College buildings were originally opened in 1901 by Lord Curzon, when, as Viceroy of India, he raised the Imperial Cadet Corps.

After the Great War H. E. Lord Rawlinson then Commander-in-Chief in India decided that a College was needed to provide the right material, chosen from among Young Indians, for the Commissioned ranks of the Indian Army.

In March 1922 H. R. H. The Prince of Wales came to Dehra Dun in person to open the Prince of Wales's Royal Indian Military College.

Up-to-date, upwards of 110 Cadets have passed from the College into the various institutions at Woolwich, Sandhurst, Cranwell, and Dehra Dun.

After tea the cadets accompanied by the Band, will give a display.

This display will last about half an hour during which time guests are requested to remain seated.

#### HIGH STANDARD OF TRAINING

15 YEARS OF WORK

DOON R.I.M. COLLEGE'S PROUD RECORD

FROM A CORRESPONDENT
DEHRA DUN, April 4.

The remarkable progress made since its inception 15 years ago 1s revealed in the following review of the activities of the Prince of Wales's Royal Military College, Dehra Dun:—

Since H.E. Lord Rawlinson, then Commander-in-Chief in India, founded the College in 1922, with a view to encouraging the right type of boy to take the Army as a career, 110 boys have passed into the Army. When considering this figure it must be borne in mind that during its infancy the College was composed of a small number of cadets none of whom were old enough to sit for the Army Entrance Examination for several years.

In 1926 there were 70 cadets; this number has since been increased to 130. It is not, however, of numbers only that the College is most proud. The records of an amazingly high percentage of its former students make remarkably fine reading.

#### SOUND EQUIPMENT

Before the founding of the Indian Military Academy, boys from the R.I.M. College distinguished themselves both at the R.M.A., Woolwich, and at the R.M.C., Sandhurst. The object of the Principal and staff of the College has not been just to give the cadets under them the necessary book knowledge to pass their Army Entrance Examination—rather has it been to equip them with a general training which might enable them to conduct themselves with credit wheresoever they might go and in whatsoever circumstances they might find themselves.

Results prove the success of this aim. Many of the final passing-out reports from Woolwich and Sandhurst were more than creditable—they were excellent. On the completion of the year's attachment to a British regiment which all officers must undergo after receiving their commissions, the Colonels of the regiments concerned have, on many occasions, expressed themselves as most genuinely sorry to lose these boys when the time has come for them to join their Indian units.

There are at present approximately 30 R.I.M.C. Old Boys in residence at the Indian Military Academy. Both the Gold Medal (twice) and the Sword of Honour have been won by R.I.M.C. boys and it is a point worthy of notice that three out of the four Under-Officers at the Indian Military Academy during the current term are former R.I.M.C. cadets.

The R.I.M. College has never had to worry over numbers. There has always been a waiting list. Parents who wish their sons to join the Army are realizing more and more the great and real advantages that go with the general education which the College provides, and, when they visit the R.I.M. College, one of the things which impresses them most, apart from the obvious smartness of the cadets, is their remarkably happy appearance.

Days at the College are well filled. Physical training parades are held daily before breakfast and the standard attained at a recent display frankly astonished all spectators. Five periods of study occupy the morning. Cricket, football, hockey, boxing, tennis and squash rackets all have ardent supporters and in the summer months an excellent swimming bath is in daily use. The standard of these games is high and the cadets are enthusiastic over them and every year are becoming more so.

There are three "sections" in the College, corresponding to "Houses" at an English Public School, and intersection rivalry over games is keen. Dinner when, as at other meals, all feed together, is followed by preparation and an early bed.

Under these happy circumstances it is not surprising that the Prince of Wales's Royal Indian Military College is going from strength to strength.

## HELP FOR MILITARY CAREER

### PUNJAB SCHEME

#### SCHOLARSHIPS FIVE ANNUALLY

SIMLA, Aug. 25.

THE Punjab Government, states a communiqué, have for some time past been considering the need for special measures to assist parents, particularly those of the martial classes, in educating their sons for a military career.

It has been represented that a number of young men suitable for commissions are prevented 'from qualifying owing to the cost of the training at the Indian Military Academy, Dehra Dun, and that the Government might well provide assistance in such cases in the form of scholarships.

On consideration the Punjab ernment have come to the conclusion that foundation of scholarships at the Academy would be of little value unless assistance were also given to parents in educating their sons up to the standard necessary to enable them to secure entrance into that institution, and that any scholarships offered should be tenable throughout the holder's school career as well as during his course at the Academy.

They have now decided, subject to Budget provision, to offer five scholar-ships a year each of Rs. 600 per annum to be held (subject to satisfactory progress) for a period not exceeding six and a half years at the Prince of Wales' Royal Indian Military College, and if the holder then passes into the Indian Military Academy for a further two and a half years in that institution.

Of five scholarships to be awarded annually it is intended to reserve two for the sons of Army officers and one for a boy of the martial classes, not being the son of a military The remaining two are to be open to all residents of the province. It is hoped to announce the details of the scheme



I should like to begin by saying what a thrill it is to come back here to the Prince of Wales Royal Indian Military Academy, 26 years all but one month after it was founded, because I happened to have been here on the 13th March, 1922, as a young A.D.C. on the Prince of Wales' staff when His Royal Highness came here and declared the College open.

I feel that your College here has a really important future before it, because now that India has got her freedom the Armed Forces of India will be of course officered entirely by Indians. I hope that this College in future will also produce candidates who will enter for the Navy as well as the Army and the Air Force.

particularly at this time. It is not just a question of keeping prepared for war; a real contribution can be made by the Armed Forces in time of peace. In this country, where at the moment there is still some communal trouble, as you all know, the Armed Forces can provide a great measure of stability. It is the Armed Forces more that any other organisation in the country which can carry out the policy hich Mahatma Gandhi gave his life; and can help to forward the policy Pandit Nehru has laid down, of building a great secular democratic state in which everybody has a real opportunity to develop a life of their own.

When you go forward eventually as officers into the Armed orces, will you, therefore, remember never to miv politics with coldiering. Will you remember that you are there to serve your country and to serve your Service and not to serve yourself. Will you also remember that however many gadgets and machines may be invented nowadays nelp the Armed Forces, those machines won't work by themselves. Those machines will only work if men make them work and therefore when you do go into the Service it is vital for you to look after the merale and tell-being of your men.

Now in the Burma campaign when I was in command out there, we'll no priority. By that I mean that every other theatre of war was

More than that we were even asked to send back some of the little we had. For example we were ordered to send back a lot of our 25nd pounder ammunition to General Eisenhower. The only thing we did have was a very high morale; and this we had to create for ourselves in the face of all these difficulties. By this I mean that all the men felt that we were better fighters than the Japanese; that we had a better cause than the Japanese; and that we could beat them and would beat them, and the result as you know was that we did beat them.

Here, in this School, you have the greatest possible opportunity of acquiring a first-class education and of developing your character. Both are of the greatest importance. Education is not a question of just sitting there and being spoon-fied. You have got to work hard to acquire it yourself. I can assure you that you can go away after six years here just as ignorant as the day you came, unless you have made a real effort to acquire the knowledge made available to you here.

I unfortunately never realised when I left school, what a difference it makes to life to know about things. The whole of life becomes interesting if you know about things. You need never stop learning it becomes more and more fun as life goes on. I learnt more during the last year in India than at any time in my life.

Evactly the same thing is necessary in the case of character lonment. Make up your mind what you are aiming at? I suggest you that if you wish to become really first-class officers; if you sh to become leaders of men, to whom the others will look up, then want each to try and make yourself into the sort of man that other will look up to; not just subordinates, nor even necessarily contemnoraries, but also your superiors. What would make them up to you? In my opinion what would make them look up to you be the fact that you were known to be completely honest with elf. That is to say, that when you make up your mind about hing, people would know that it was your honest conviction; you had an open mind, and were prepared to see both sides of the

question. People would feel that you were completely fairminded and that when you come to a decision it was done for the highest motives and not for some selfish reason; and that you had enough courage to stick by your decision even if it happened to be an unpopular one or sneered at. That is the sort of character you want to have.

You have a unique opportunity in this School to acquire both education and develop a fine character. India is short of establishments like this. There are 300 millions in the Dominion of India.

Very few have the opportunities that you have. You are among the pioneers round whom the future of India can be built. It is the men with education, with knowledge, and with character who can make this country great, so remember when you go out that you owe something to the country in return for the opportunities that you have had here.

In conclusion, I would like to tell you a small incident as an example of what I would call the very best form of leadership.

During the war, in South-East Asia, we were going to fly in a whole lot of men behind the Japanese lines in Burma to disrupt them. They were to be flown in under the command of General Wingate. I had got from America a special air unit known as No. 1 Air Commando, which was to fly these men in in special gliders with tug aircraft to tow the gliders. Wingate had been operating behind the Burma lines the year before; two sites had been selected in the jungle on which gliders could be landed, and given the code hames of BROADWAY and PICCADILLY.

Assam from which this great expedition is to start; row upon row of gliders into which the men are marching with their full equipment. The pilots of the tug aircraft are warming up their engines. Men are attaching the tow ropes; and at this moment the Photo Reconnaissance. Flight comes in with the latest pictures taken of the landing strips in the Jungle. Photographs 4 days before showed they were clear, but as an officer runs out of the dark room waving the wet prints of the photos taken at BROADWAY and PICCADILLY that evening, they find

PICCADILLY has been obstructed by tree trunks which elements had drawn across. On the other hand BROADWAY shows no such obstruction, but the quection is whether the Japanese have got wise to the whole plan. However, General Slim, who commanded the 14th Army and Air Marshal Baldwin who commanded the 3rd Tactical Air Force decided that the operation was to continue. That meant that all the pilots of the tug aircraft, and all the milots of the gliders, who were going to go to PICCADILLY, would not have to go to BROADWAY. Not only was it a strip that they did not know, but it would have to accommodate twice as many gliders. You must realise that for weeks beforehand the pilots and been trained with maps, photographs and models of the PICCADILLY strip and now at the last moment they were going to be asked to fly to an unknown strip, having only a few minutes to look at photographs and maps. Imagine the effect on their morale, going out on something already risky and now made twice as dangerous.

American Air Ace. General Slim was very keen to see how he would deal with his pilots. He followed and watched Cochran as he jumped on to the bonnet of a jeep, and collected the pilots of the aircraft and gliders originally destined to go to PICCADILLY and now switched at the last moment to BROADWAY. I repeat that this was a very trying moment because it was enough to upset any pilot to feel he was going to have his objective changed at the last moment. But Colonel Cochran got up with magnificent enthusiasm and said "Boys, we have found a better place to go to". Their spirits actually went up instead of down.

This is the spirit of true leadership and the sort of spirit I feel you want to carry through with you in after life.

It is a very great privilege to come back here again. It is a pleasure to see all of you and to know that the Royal Indian Military College is carrying on the great traditions with which it started. I wish you all the best of luck.


